

Summer Public Works Labourer

Reports to: Assistant Manager of Operations

Term: 8-week temporary position

General Outline, Scope and Purpose:

Reporting to the Assistant Manager of Operations, the successful candidate will perform a variety of duties related to the operation and maintenance of Village Parks and essential services. The Summer Public Works Labourer will demonstrate good judgement and common sense and be motivated to develop new skills and knowledge. Activities related to this position are often strenuous in nature and require an individual who is physically fit and safety conscious.

The Summer Public Works Labourer position is part of the Collective Agreement between the Village of Pemberton and Canadian Union of Public Employees, Local 2010.

Description of Activities:

- Support provision of essential services provided by the Village, adhering to COVID-19 protocols:
 - Cleaning public washrooms and facilities
 - Litter pickup and garbage collection
 - Garbage and recycling disposal
- Carry out works related to municipal parks maintenance and landscaping development, maintaining flower beds, trees, shrubs, trails, turf areas, parks including, but not limited to, weeding, mowing grass, litter pickup, pruning and fertilizing
- Support parks and trail maintenance to provide a safe place for the public to recreate while practicing physical distancing
- Operate and maintain tools and equipment related to the work, including, but not limited to, lawn mowers, weed eaters, edger, and janitorial equipment
- Perform cleaning, painting and minor repairs to municipal facilities and equipment
- Perform other duties as assigned.

Qualifications:

- Ability to work both independently and as a member of team
- Interest in learning and development
- Experience in facility maintenance, cleaning or public works an asset
- Experience in landscaping or horticulture field an asset
- Workplace safety certifications, such as First Aid, an asset
- Valid Class 5 B.C. Driver's License and satisfactory Driver's Abstract
- Applicants must meet the requirements of the Government of Canada's Summer Jobs Program, which include, but are not limited to, being between the ages of 15 and 30 years of age at the start of employment.
