

# Bulletin: Builder Incentive Offer For Energy Step Code Compliance for Part 9 Residential Buildings

## Purpose

To inform staff, building contractors and residential property owners of the Village's Builder Incentive Offer for Energy Step Code compliance.

## Background

Under the Village of Pemberton Building Bylaw 921, 2021 any residential building, including a detached house, carriage house, garden suite, duplex, or row house, regulated by Part 9 of the Building Code, excluding a manufactured home, must be designed and constructed to meet the minimum performance requirements specified in Step 4 of the Energy Step Code. Except for buildings included in subsection 28.1, and farm buildings, any standard building with residential, business and personal services or mercantile occupancies, or a combination of be designed and constructed to meet the minimum performance requirements specified in Step 3 of the Energy Step Code.

The BC Energy Step Code is a performance path to energy efficiency in buildings that exceeds the current prescriptive requirements of the BC Building Code.

In recognition of the challenge of transitioning to a new metric, the Village, with the support of a grant from BC Hydro, is offering financial incentives to builders.

Incentives are available until March 31, 2022, while funds last.

## **Incentive 1: Mid-Construction Air Tightness Testing**

Builders who conduct a mid-construction air tightness test are eligible for a financial incentive of up to \$500 upon submission of the mid-construction blower door test report completed by a certified Energy Advisor.

# Incentive 2: Achievement of a Step higher than mandated by Building Bylaw No. 921, 2021:

Builders who achieve a Step higher than the Step mandated by Building Bylaw 921, 2021 are eligible for an incentive of up to \$500 upon final inspection and submission of the As-Built Compliance Report prepared by a certified Energy Adviser.

Did you start your build before Step 4 became mandatory? You are eligible for this incentive if you achieve Step 5 or higher. If you started your build in 2018 before Step 3 or 4 became mandatory, you may also be eligible.

## **CleanBC Better Homes New Construction Program**

The CleanBC Better Homes New Construction Program provides rebates up to \$15,000 for the construction of new, high-performance, electric homes. Through the CleanBC plan, the Province is supporting the adoption of the BC Energy Step Code and making energy efficient, climate-friendly homes more affordable and accessible for British Columbians.

#### Available Rebates

#### Choose your rebate pathway:

- Energy Step Code pathway: build a new home that meets a minimum BC Energy Step code level and uses electric space and water heating systems.
  OR
- Heat pump pathway: build a new home that uses an electric heat pump for space heating or water heating, regardless of Energy Step Code level.

#### Choose your add-on rebates:

- All-Electric Bonus: build a home with no fossil fuel (e.g. natural gas, propane, oil) connection whatsoever (including for cooking, fireplaces, or other uses) and receive an additional \$4,000 per home.
- Energy Advisor Support Rebate: work with a Program Qualified Energy Advisor and receive an additional \$1,000 per home.
