

Builders' Bulletin: Swimming Pools and Hot-Tubs

This Bulletin is for informational purposes only. A site plan with pool location is required with a permit application. In addition to submitting a Permit Application and a site plan, please be sure to consult the relevant Village of Pemberton Bylaws or contact Staff if you have questions: developmentservices@pemberton.ca

PERMITS

A building permit is required for installation of any in-ground pool or hot tub and for any aboveground pool that remains in place year round or is seasonal.

Seasonal above-ground pools and hot-tubs require one permit and can be torn down and re-erected seasonally as required.

All pools subject to building permits must comply with the requirements of Part 21 of Building Bylaw No 912, 2021.

FENCING

Pools that have a depth exceeding 0.6 metres at any point, including hot tubs, must comply with the fencing requirements of Section 7.30 of Zoning Bylaw No. 832, 2018:

 pools shall be enclosed in a structure or surrounded by a fence not less than 1.5 m in and not more than 1.8 m in height, designed to prevent climbing, and where equipped with gates, be operated on hinges and a lock and be able to be freely opened only from the inside.

SETBACKS

An above-ground pool or hot tub may not be located within 7.5 m of the front lot line. A permanent swimming pool may project into a front, side or rear setback area provided that the pool shall not be constructed within **1.8 m** of a lot line.

APPLICATIONS

Permit Applications can be submitted through the online permitting system. Please head to the <u>Building Services Page</u> to apply. The standard fee for a pool permit is **\$250. Additional** fees may be required for in-ground pools if excavation is involved.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION TO BE SUBMITTED:

- Engineer's Drawings and Schedule B if over two (2) feet deep
- Scaled Plan showing the location, enclosure details, depth and dimensions of the pool and its structural details and all water supply piping and appurtenances.
- Land Title Documents dated within 30 days of the permit application

*Please note if you live in a Hillside Development, a Geotechnical Review may be required.
