

# PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN COUNCIL MEETINGS IN CONFORMANCE WITH PHYSICAL DISTANCING REQUIREMENTS

In order to minimize the spread of the COVID-19 virus, the Village of Pemberton is providing an alternative to viewing Council, Committee, and Board meetings and allow for public participation, as per the Village's <u>Open Question Period Policy</u> which is held during a Regular Meeting only. This alternative allows the Village to adhere to physical distancing requirements, follows the Minister of Public Safety's Ministerial Order M0192 (which suspends certain requirements of the *Community Charter*), and provides a way for the public to ask questions during the Open Question Period at the end of a Regular Council meeting.

Please be advised, all electronically held Council, Committee, and Board Meetings are recorded. Please read the <u>Video Recording & Broadcasting Policy for Electronically held Council,</u> <u>Committee and Board Meetings</u>.

#### VIRTUAL PARTICIPATION BY ZOOM VIDEO CONFERENCING

### How do I join a meeting via Zoom Video Conferencing?

Please visit: <u>https://zoom.us/</u> and either sign-up for a free Zoom account or continue as a guest.

Download the <u>Zoom software</u> on your personal computer or download the mobile app to your smart phone or tablet. Once you have downloaded the Zoom software you will be ready for the meeting on **May 11<sup>th</sup>, 2021, at 5:30 p.m.** 

Pre-registration is not required, however, you may be required to provide your name and email address when attending the webinar.

### How can I provide Public Comment on Zoom?

An Open Question Period is available at the end of each Regular Council Meeting (Committee of the Whole Meetings, Special Council Meetings, and Board Meetings do not allow for an open question period).

Once Mayor Richman has invited comments from the public regarding the Development Variance Permit or announced Open Question Period, please do the following:

- Click on the "Raise Hand" feature in the webinar controls. This will notify Village Staff that you have raised your hand.
- Village Staff will unmute your microphone when it is your turn to ask your question.
- A prompt will appear to confirm you would like to be unmuted. Once you accept the prompt, you will have the opportunity to ask your question.
- Once your question has ended, you will be muted again.

Please be reminded that as per the Village of Pemberton Open Question Period Policy:

- Only questions directly related to business discussed during the Council Meeting are allowed;
- Questions must be truly questions and not statements of opinions or policy by the questioner
- Not more than two (2) separate subjects per questioner will be allowed
- Attending Press will be allowed preference prior to proceeding to the public
