




Provincial Transit Ridership






Pemberton Local Ridership

Free Transit for Children 12 and Under

- Included in the April 2020 BC Budget Announcement
- Free Transit in BC for children 12 and under
- Effective September 2021
- Revenue Compensation provided by the Province





Fare Review Timeline

- Last Fare Review December 2010
 - Revision process started pre-Covid
- Safe Restart Funding Requirements
 - Maintain Service Levels to ensure consistency
 - o Fare Increases capped at 2.3% per year max to maintain affordability
 - o = \$.06 increase on cash fare of \$2.50
- BC Transit is reviewing current Fare Strategy and technology
- BC Transit committed to Fare Review in 2023
 - Safe Restart requirement ends March 2023



Regional Transit

- Sea to Sky Transit Corridor Regional Study completed in 2017
- •Sea to Sky Regional Transit Committee formed in 2018
- •Sea to Sky Regional Transit Commission structure approved by BC Transit Board
- •Funding Options were explored with province in spring of 2019 but ultimately an agreement was not reached
 - COVID affected 2020
- •2021 Renewed optimism for the committee and the province to reopen discussions and work to find creative new solutions to bring Regional transit to life
