PEMBERTON BIKE SKILLS PARK OFFICIALLY OPENED

World-class recreation facility in Pemberton now open to the public

PEMBERTON, BC – The Pemberton Bike Skills Park, located at Den Duyf Park (formerly the Pemberton and District Recreation Site) is officially open to the public.

"The Village of Pemberton is delighted to welcome the public to the newly completed Pemberton Bike Skills Park," said Mike Richman, Village of Pemberton Mayor.

"This fantastic recreation facility will give riders of all ages and abilities an opportunity to grow competency and skill in a scalable and controlled manner."

The park provides residents and visitors access to a quality, world-class recreation facility, identified as a regional priority due to the area's limited recreation facilities.

"On behalf of the Squamish-Lillooet Regional District, and as the Area Director representing Electoral Area C, I am excited to see the official opening of the Pemberton Bike Skills Park, and to welcome the community to experience this much-anticipated amenity," said SLRD Electoral Area C Director, Russell Mack.

"The park is an important addition to this recreation site, in a growing area of the valley, and I have no doubt it will be enjoyed by many, and for years to come. Congratulations to the Village of Pemberton, for securing funding for this project, and thank you to all of the partners for working together to provide recreation services to our residents."

The park includes four zones comprising a Pump Track, Skills Park, Drop Zone and Jump Lines. The Drop Zones and Jump Lines include a range of difficulty ratings allowing riders to progress as their skill and comfort level increase.

"Mountain Biking is an extremely popular sport in the Sea-to-Sky region so I am extremely pleased to have a facility of this calibre, that allows riders to learn and grow, available to our community," said Mike Richman, Village of Pemberton Mayor.

The park has been developed in partnership with the Pemberton Off-Road Cycling Association (PORCA)

"While Pemberton's world-class bike trails are in high demand, they are extremely technical in nature given Pemberton's terrain and topography. The majority of Pemberton's trails require an intermediate







skill level and there are very few flat beginner trails on which to learn or practice on," said Ian Kruger, President, PORCA.

"This Park will provide a quality facility where riders can progress their skills to better prepare them to tackle more technical trails."

"It's great to see the growth of mountain biking in municipalities across the province, both locally and as a draw for tourists," said Nathan Cullen, Minister of Municipal Affairs.

"This park will provide residents and visitors access to a world-class facility, designed through a community-based approach, and will continue our province's reputation as a leader in this sport."

The Bike Skills Park is open from dawn to dusk daily except during Quiet Hours (11pm – 7am Monday to Saturday and 11pm – 9am Sunday and statutory holidays).

The construction of the park was made possible by \$974,258 in funding from the Province of British Columbia through the Community Economic Resilience stream of the Community Economic Recovery Infrastructure Program and \$25,000 in funding from the Whistler Blackcomb Foundation.

The Pemberton Bike Skills Park is one of four outdoor recreation amenities planned at Den Duyf Park. The site concept was informed by extensive community consultation in 2013.
