

Village of PEMBERTON Where are revenues taxes/collections directed?


- Tax revenues fund various services, programs, reserves, including:

BC Assessment- Continued

The most important factor is not how much your assessed value has changed, but how your assessed value has changed relative to the average change for your property class in your municipality or taxing jurisdiction.

You can find your municipality or taxing jurisdiction's average change listed on your annual assessment notice or via BC Assessment's online <u>interactive map</u>.

	Your Property's Value Change	Property Tax Impact
1.	LOWER than Average Change for Property Class	Taxes Likely DECREASE*
2.	SIMILAR to the Average Change for Property Class	Taxes Likely DO NOT CHANGE*
3.	HIGHER than Average Change for Property Class	Taxes Likely INCREASE

* assumes there are no changes in the distribution of budget funding between property class for your taxing jurisdiction and/or any other taxing agency.

Market Conditions: CPI and Costs

• British Columbia's consumer price index (CPI) in December 2022 was **6.6% higher** (unadjusted) than in December 2021.

- Village of Pemberton experiencing pressures including many double digit % cost increases and additional surcharges (amplified by geography)
 - VoP challenging and rejecting many bids, and awarding some work to new vendors through retendering process, stopping or deferring activity
 - Impact is most pronounced around long-lead capital quotes on a YoY basis
- Aging infrastructure and equipment requiring increased maintenance





Market Conditions: Labour and Mitigating Turnover Expense

- The Village of Pemberton has experienced turnover of 25% in 2022 and 35% in 2021
- Material recruitment expenses should be avoided in 2023 through targeted investment in retention and anticipated reduction in turnover subject to adequate attention and investment

Key initiatives in 2023:

- Conduct review to ensure competitiveness
- Defining retention strategy and measures
- Targeted investment in training, development and succession planning
 - Regulatory requirements (Operational, Fire, Rescue, Certifications)
 - Development and growth
 - Cost pressures from return to in person sessions offset by savings from some hybrid or virtual offerings (relative to pre-Covid 19 budgets)



2023 Draft Capital Highlights

- Daycare
 - Provincial Funding, New Spaces Fund
 - Site prepared in Fall 2022, construction will be underway in 2023, estimated completion in early 2024
 - Project Cost \$3.66M
- Water Treatment Facility
 - Awaiting results of grant application, jointly funded through Federal, Provincial grants
 - The proposed plant will replace existing facilities and will provide additional filtration for iron and manganese
 - To be located adjacent to existing reservoirs, centralizing water operations
 - Estimated Project Cost of \$8.2M





2023 Draft Capital Highlights-Continued

- Fernwood Watermain and Pressure Reducing Valve Replacement
 - Essential distribution system at end of life
 - Proposed funding through Gas Tax, Reserves
 - Phased, estimated 2023 Cost \$280k
- McRae Rd Water Main Upsizing
 - Current McRae Rd water main supplied across private property with lease obligations to upsize
 - This will increase capacity for possible future Industrial Park watermain looping
 - Proposed funding through Gas Tax, Reserves
 - Estimated 2023 Cost of \$270k
- Industrial Park Generator
 - For security of sanitary service during power outages, and will meet growing need as industrial park continues to be built out and sewage flows increase
 - Estimated 2023 Cost of \$100k





2023 Draft Capital Highlights-Continued

- Engine 10 Replacement
 - Replacement of end of life apparatus, with long lead chassis order in 2023 and build completion in 2025
 - Reserves and borrowing
 - Estimated 2022 cost of \$150k, total \$750k
- EV Chargers
 - Level 3 75kW fast chargers
 - Grant funded through Natural Resources Canada
 - Estimated budget in 2022 of \$150k
- Amenity Building at Den Duyf Park
 - Fields complete, with Amenity building and parking lot construction to commence in 2023
 - Will include bathrooms, storage, snack bar, community space, EV Chargers
 - Includes funding throg Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program, CACs, DCCs, SLRD
 - Estimated budget of \$2.6M



2023 Draft Capital Highlights-Continued

- Park and Ride
 - Funded through Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program- Rural and Northern Communities Program
 - Design in 2023, construction completion anticipated 2026
 - \$1.9M Estimated Budget
- Operations and Parks Fleet Upgrades for end of life equipment
 - Funded through MFA borrowing and Reserves
 - Replacement of Bucket Truck
 - Retired due to safety issues
 - \$40k Estimated budget
 - F550 Plow and Sander
 - Supports hillside communities and summer operations
 - \$110k Estimated Budget
 - F150 8' Bed- Garbage Truck
 - Replaces existing 2008 Truck at end of life
 - \$40k Estimated Budget




- In 2022, Reserve contributions included:
 - Capital: \$347,258
 - Water: \$324,000
 - Sewer: \$160,000 (with an approved increase of \$40,000 to \$200,000)
- Aging infrastructure and smart/ current growth factors in determining future reserves, amongst other factors
- Asset Replacement Financial Strategy prepared by Your City for the Village of Pemberton proposes asset health score scenarios between 76% and 93% (consumption and past life ratio) to affordably keep assets healthy
 - Suggests scenarios that maintain overall increases between \$56-\$78/yr
 - VOP staff to incorporate recommendations into budget for Council direction





- January Direction from Council around service objectives to inform draft
- February- Capital and project budgets drafts to Council
- March/April- Operating Budget Draft and Tax Implications to Council
- April- Readings, adoption
